WHAT IS E2?

- Environmental Emergency Regulations, 2016
- Imposes extraordinary obligations on facilities with substances representing unacceptable hazard to EHS

WHAT ARE THE HAZARDS?

- Carcinogenicity;
- Corrosiveness;
- Inhalation hazards;
- Explosiveness;
- Possibility of pool fires;
- Aquatic toxicity

WHAT'S NEW?

- 1. Annual <u>exercise</u> of plan parts (with rolling 5-year completion)
- 2. Consolidating into 1 hazard
- 3. Plan with "adequate measures" for any emergency
- 4. Periodic reporting (double obligation with CMP?)
- 5. 49 new substances; and...

PRE-EMERGENCY PUBLIC NOTIFICATIONS

- 6. Public notification of the:
- a) <u>possibility</u> of an environmental emergency; and
- b) the potential consequences of environmental emergency

MANDATED CONSIDERATIONS

- Properties of substance and expected maximum storage during year;
- Commercial manufacturing, processing and other site activities;
- Affect on surrounding properties in worst-case scenario:
 - -hospitals, schools, residences;
 - -parks, forest and sensitive lands
 - -water sources, water bodies

WHAT TO SAY?

- SDS content?
- GHS pictograms?
- Dangerous Goods Warnings?
 - -too little and not adequate
 - too much and an admission of unsafe operation
