Course Description

This course is designed to be an overview of the math, chemistry, biology, and environmental science concepts that are fundamentals to chemical hazard communication. Emphasis is placed on the principles most relevant to an understanding of how chemicals cause adverse health, physical, and environmental effects, and how these effects are quantified and classified. This course is aligned with the Globally Harmonized System of Classification and Labelling of Chemicals (GHS), and has been updated to align with the new expectations of the American Industrial Hygiene Association's Competency Assessment for the SDS and Label Authoring Registry.

This is intended to be basic course and there are no prerequisites.

Intended Audience

Hazard communication professionals that are new to the profession and whose backgrounds are in areas other than these core sciences. Also, practicing hazard communicators who simply want to increase the confidence with which that carry out their responsibilities or who are preparing for the AIHA Registry exam and desire to strengthen their skills in these areas.
