

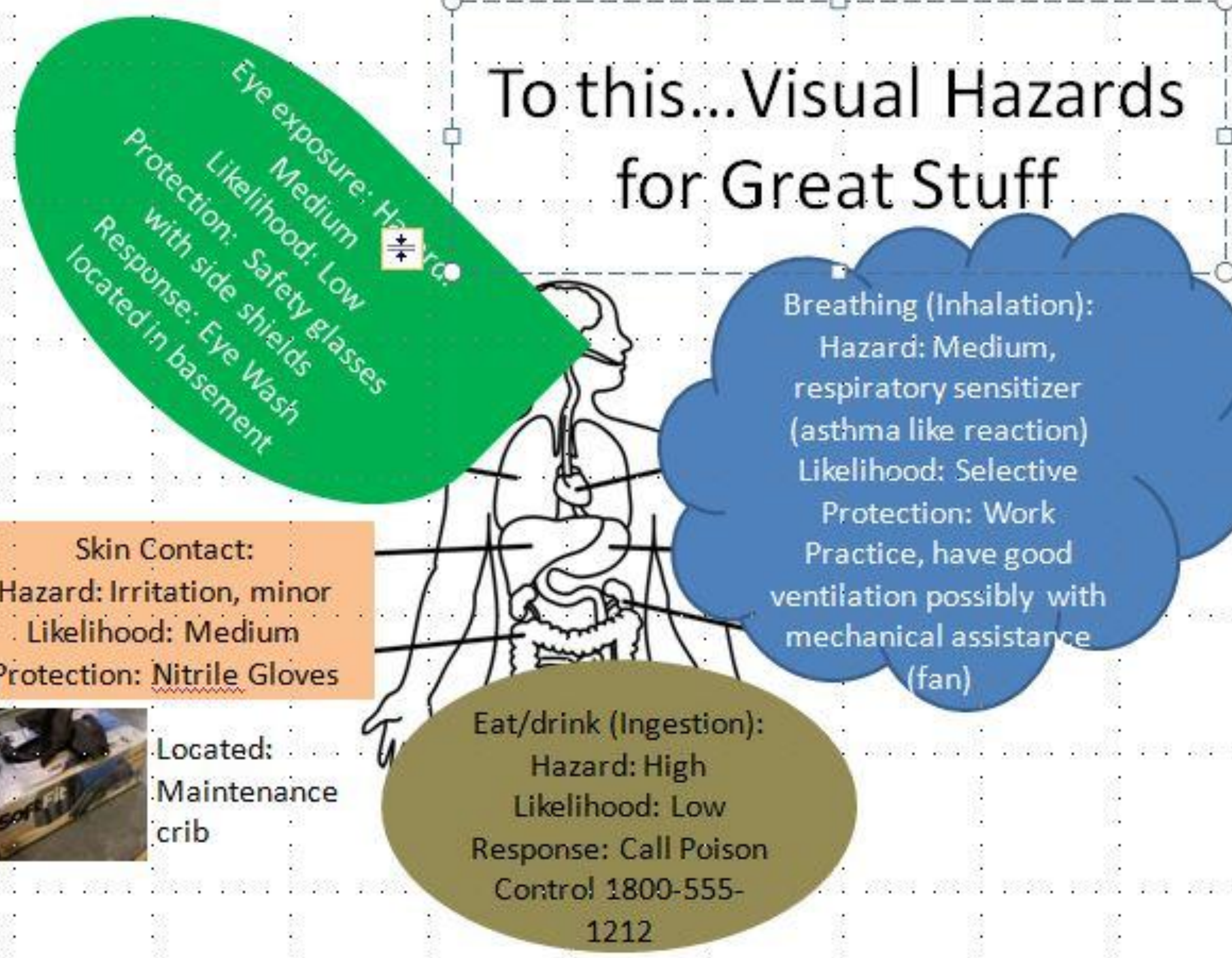
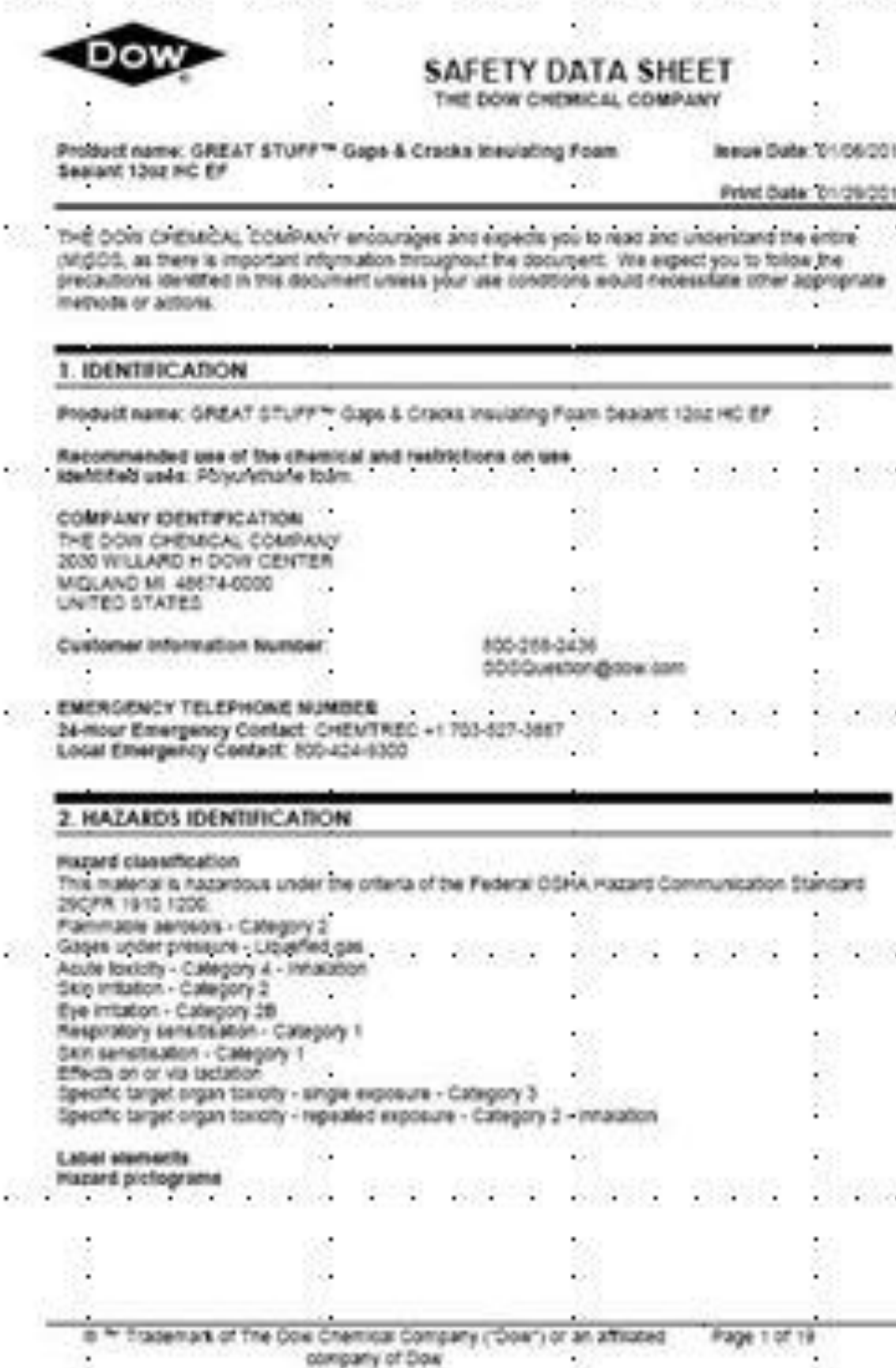
Visual SDS (or, more accurately, Visual Chemical Safety) What might it look like?

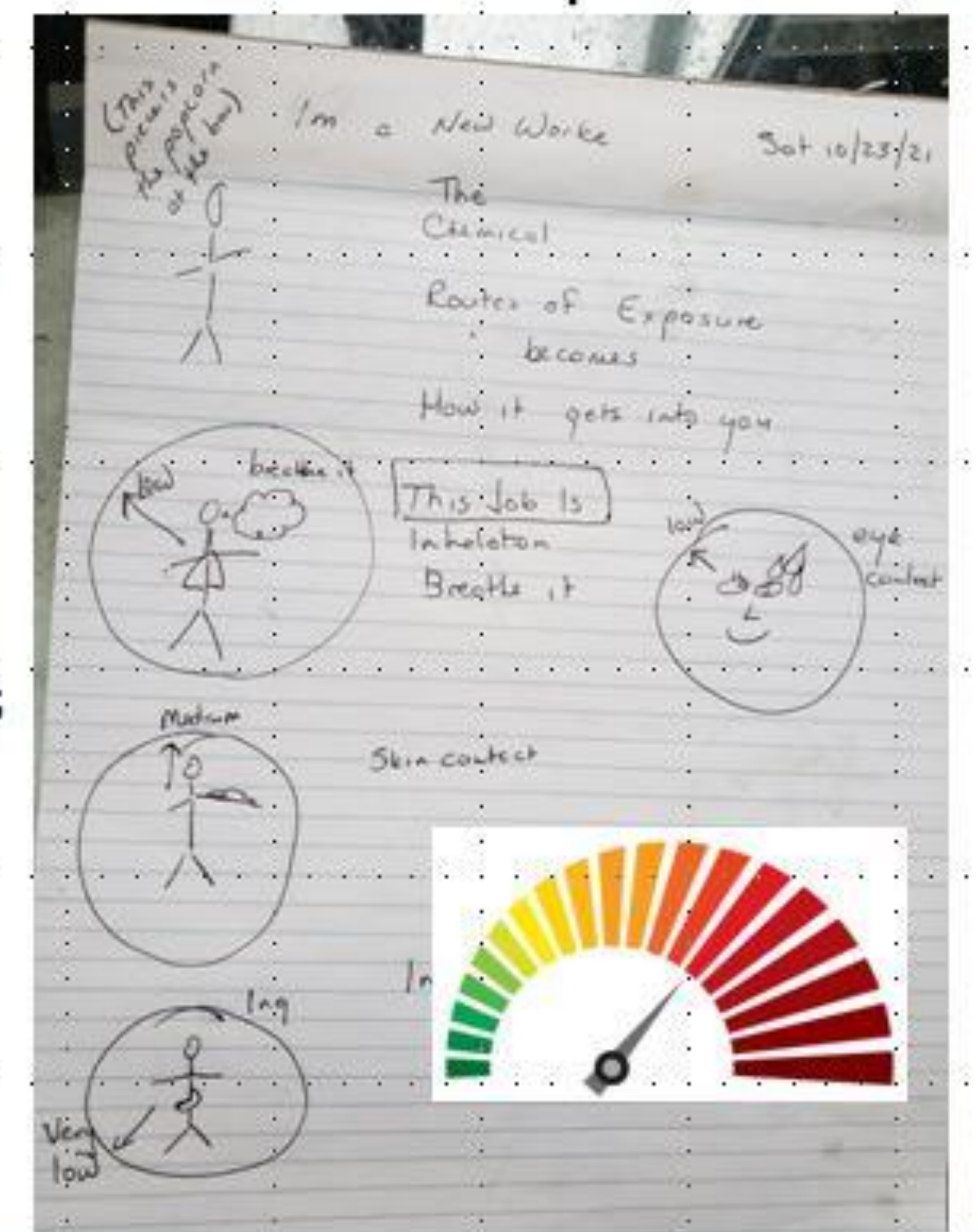
Let's start with some examples and go from there: Great Stuff

Hand drawing - Routes of exposure

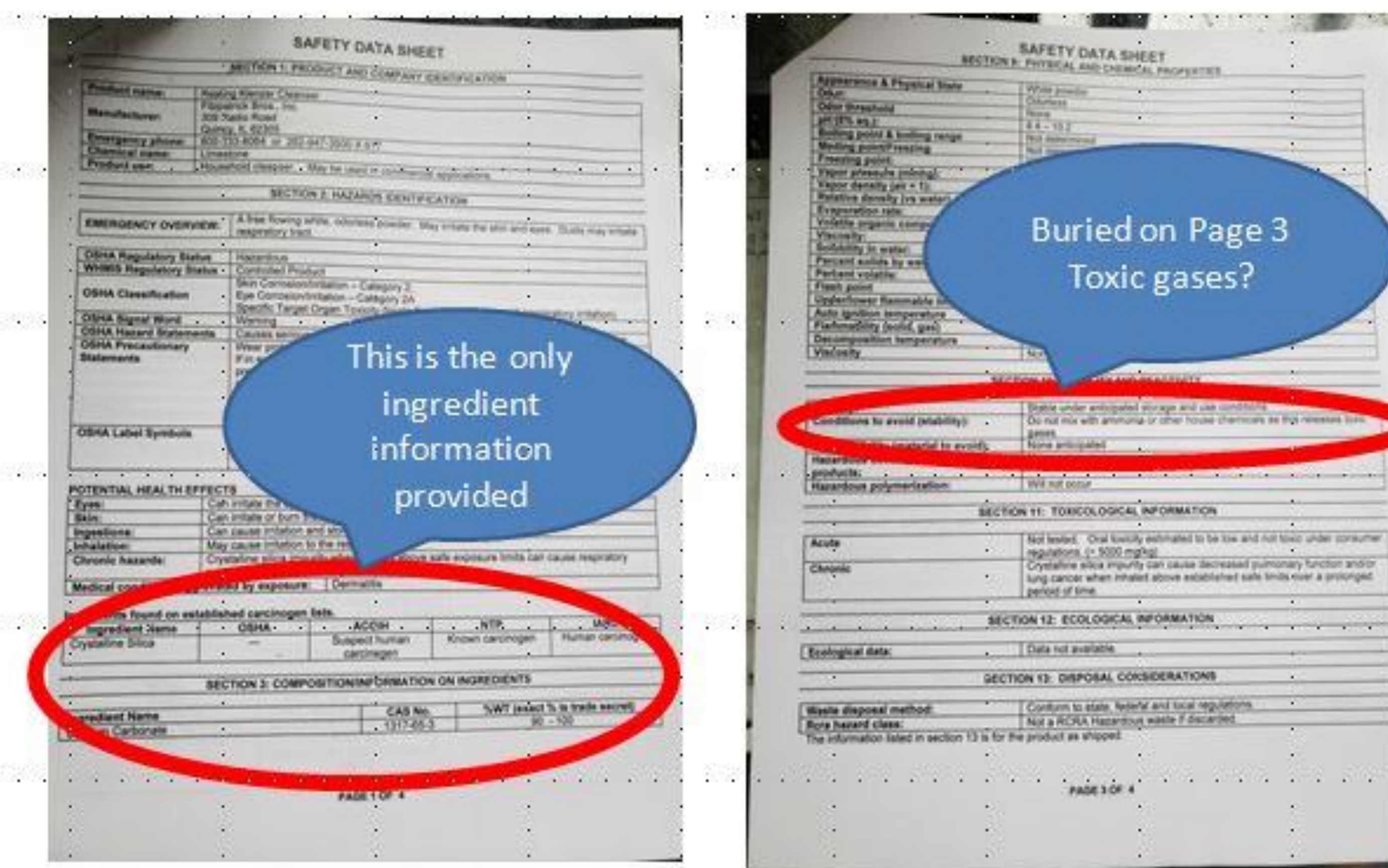
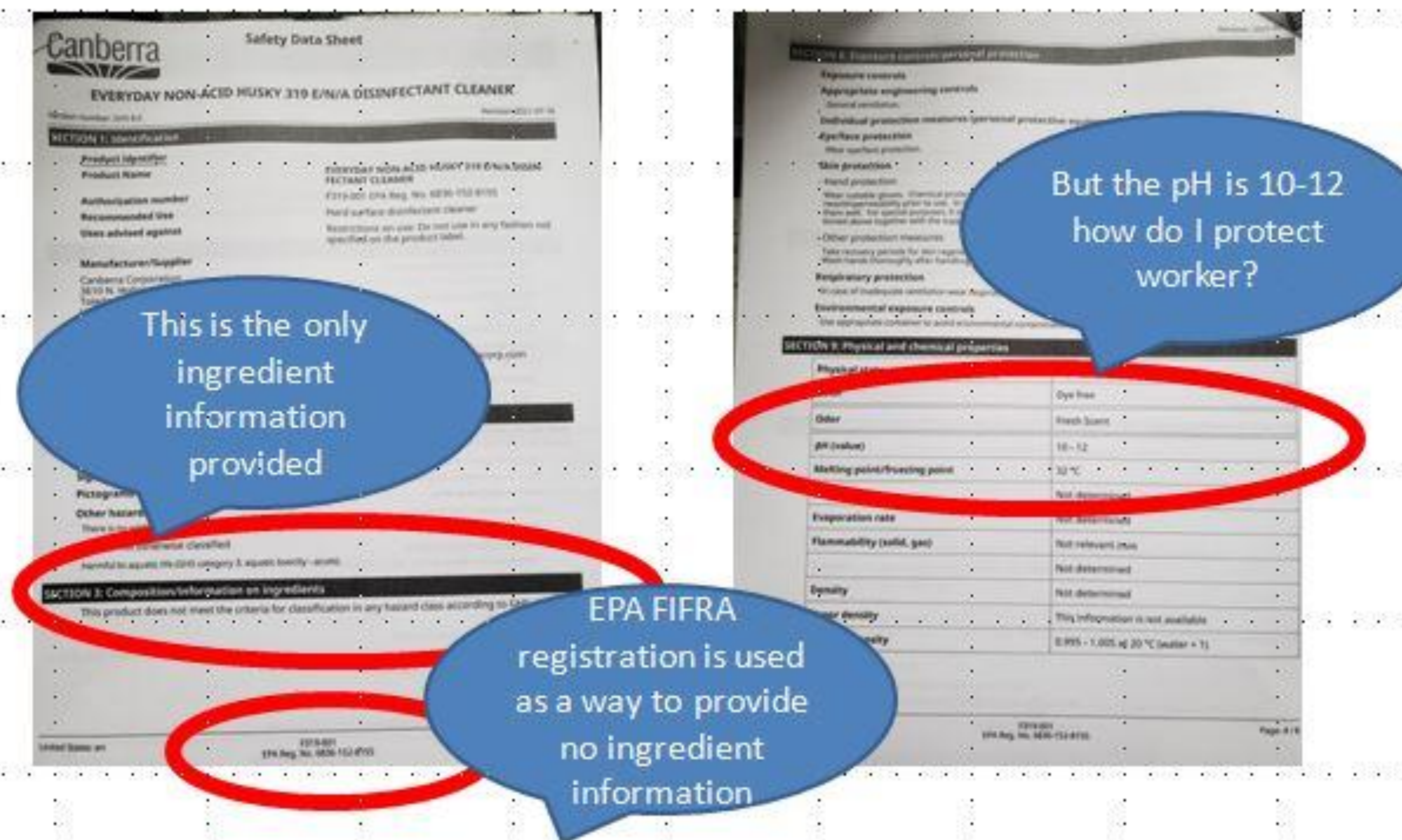
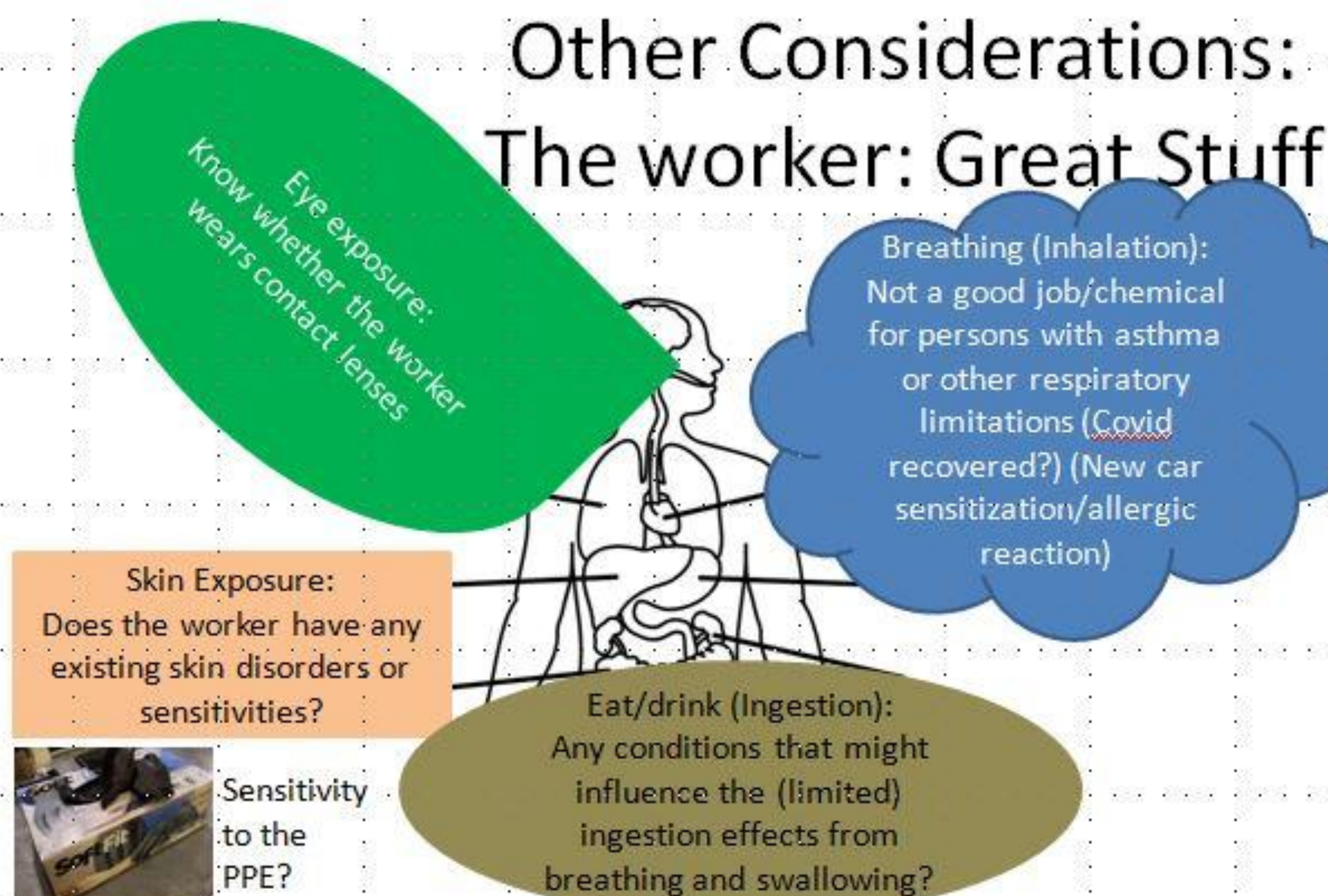
- (sometimes hand drawings are used to indicate how preliminary the draft is)
