Canada - WHMIS 2015 - Hazardous Products Regulations (HPR) 2015 - FEDERAL GAZETTE 2021. United Nations - Globally Harmonised Systems 2009 and revisions. United States NPRM - 29CFR 2021.

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(H)(P)HNOC

Section 2 MUST SHOW specific Health and Physical Hazard Not Otherwise Classified (HNOC) HHNOC and PHNOC MUST have Signal Word Danger and applicable Hazard Symbol



Any known or suspected hazard (health and physical) that is not covered by HAZCOM 2012 **MUST** be in Section 2 under sub-section HNOC **HNOC MUST NOT BE SHOWN on Labels**

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Date of Release for Shipment

NOT required to be shown on labels because HPR requires that the manufacturer being aware of MAJOR CHANGE MUST informed its clients and change the SDS within 90 days and all labels within 180 days

Need "Release for shipment date" on a label?


MUST BE SHOWN ON LABELS

Section 3 Concentration Ranges

MUST BE THE NAROWEST MANDATORY RANGE APPLICABLE CAN BE A COMBINATION OF 2 CONSECUTIVE RANGES WITHOUT HAVING ONE THAT IS OUTSIDE THE **POSSIBLE CONCENTRATION OF THE SUBSTANCE IN THE MIXTURE**

Ingredient name	% (w/w)	CAS number
Benzene	1 - 7	71-43-2
Ingredient name	%	CAS number
Ingredient name Benzene	% ≥1 - <3	CAS number 71-43-2

MUST BE THE NAROWEST MANDATORY RANGE APPLICABLE NO COMBINATION IS ALLOWED!



Range combined

Separate ranges
