This workshop is designed to assist hazard communication professionals preparing to sit for the AIHA Registry's Competency Assessment for the SDS and Label Authoring Registry. This course will address both the knowledge and skills portions of the assessment by focusing on the eight rubrics defined as the body of knowledge for SDS and label authoring and by incorporating workshop activities for each rubric. This course has been updated to align with the recently updated and released [SDS & Label Authoring Registry Proficiency Study Guide](#).

This is not intended to be an introductory course. Rather, participants should have much of the education, training and experience expected by the AIHA Registry. Participants can use this course as a final "tune-up" prior to sitting for the Competency Assessment or as an initial assessment of their knowledge and skills within a comprehensive Assessment preparation strategy.
